These programs go beyond academic research and financial aid, encompassing a broader spectrum of initiatives within the university community. During the academic year of 2021-2022, Glocal University proudly admitted students from low-income backgrounds and offered scholarships amounting to 40,271,280 INR, benefitting a total of 537 students. 1.3.2 UNIVERSITY TARGET FOR BOTTOM 20% HOUSEHOLD
